COSMETOLOGY

Location:

FCAVC, Kendallville, IN

Course Description:

Students enrolled in this program receive 1,500 hours of training during the two-year program in areas such as hair cutting, coloring, perms, facials, facial makeup, bacteriology, nails and nail disorders, chemistry, personal grooming, and many more areas. Training follows the state-mandated curriculum with the goal of students earning their cosmetology license upon successful completion of the State Board exam. Students in the program are also highly active in Community Service projects.

Program Duration:

Cosmetology Students follow the normal FCAVC calendar with the addition of evening and Saturday hours in order to complete the required number of hours.

Credits:

Students enrolled in Cosmetology receive credit based upon the type of schedule offered at each school.

Enrollment Procedure:

Students need to contact their Guidance Counselor for an application. Enrollment for the first year students is through an application process conducted by the Cosmetology Instructors and Four County Directors.

Fees:

Students are responsible for a one-time kit fee. This fee includes textbooks, supplies and smocks. Full payment is due no later than the first day of class in August.

DIRECT HEALTH CARE (DHC)

Location:

FCAVC, Kendallville, IN

Course Description:

Training in this program prepares students for a career in the health care industry. Direct Health Care is a three-hour, one semester class for students interested in nursing and direct patient/resident care. Upon completion of this one semester course and successfully passing the Indiana State exam, students earn their Certified Nursing Assistants (CNA) certification through the Indiana State Department of Health, Long Term Care CNA curriculum. This curriculum includes a required 30 hours of classroom instruction; demonstration and practice of 48 skills, and 75 hours of clinical work at a long term care facility. Health Care Provider CPR certification and First Aid training are also obtained through this course. Caring for the elderly and debilitated requires patience, compassion and stamina. For young people interested in nursing as a future career, Direct Health Care offers an excellent start.

Program Duration:

This program is one semester (18 weeks) open to juniors and seniors.

Credits:

Students enrolled in Direct Health Care receive credit based upon the type of schedule offered at each school. Students may earn up to five (5) hours of dual credit through Ivy Tech Community College.

Enrollment Procedure:

Students must be able to read at a 7th grade level or better according to ISDH standards to be considered for enrollment to this course. An application for enrolling in this course may be obtained by contacting the high school Guidance Counselor. Enrollment is through an application and interview process conducted by the DHC Instructor. After being accepted into the course, students are required to have a limited criminal background check, to be completed in the first few weeks of class.

HEALTH OCCUPATIONS EDUCATION (HOE)

Location:

FCAVC, Kendallville, IN

FCAVC, LaGrange, IN

Course Description:

To introduce and prepare students for careers in the health care field, Health Occupations Education (HOE) is available. This three hour, morning class provides high school seniors the opportunity and participation in hospitals and health care facilities within the community. Throughout the academic year, students are introduced to basic patient care skills and a variety of careers by participating in one to two week clinical rotations. They not only discover the skills necessary for each career, they also explore the educational requirements needed to reach certain levels of professional expertise. Students will achieve CPR certification and First Aid training.

Program Duration:

This program is open to seniors only.

Credits:

Students enrolled in the HOE program receive credit based upon the type of schedule offered at each school. Students may earn up to six (6) hours of dual credit through Ivy Tech Community College.

Enrollment Procedure:

Students need to contact their Guidance Counselor for an application. Enrollment is through an application and interview process conducted by the HOE Instructor. All students chosen for this program is subject to a limited criminal background check.

Fees:
